## How was the year 2020?

It was a challenging and pivotal year for the organization, as it marked the moment when it was formally established as a non-profit entity. Despite restrictions on in-person mobility, limited funding, and social tensions in Colombia, the organization carried out its work plan and closed the last two months of the year with strong results.

## Designed projects and local initiatives under development:

- Environmental education strategy to reduce critical points of improper solid-waste disposal in the department of Quindío: fewer waste materials on the streets   
- Weaving Peace in Ciudad Bolívar   
- Environmental Care Networks   
- Protecting the Sea in Santa Marta, Colombia   
- Complementary strategic plan proposal to strengthen solid-waste management in the department of Quindío   

## Research:

- Status of Soil Degradation in Colombia, 2020
- Mapping of Colombia's National Natural Parks, 2020
- Successful Techniques for Building Community Environmental Leadership, 2020
- Research Methodology with a Focus on Sustainable Development, 2020

## **Impacts:**

In the first quarter of 2020, direct interventions were carried out with young communities, fishermen, and the LGBTIQ+ community. With the onset of the pandemic, actions shifted to online interventions, and in the final two months of the year, during the time of legal constitution, hybrid actions were conducted with traditionally excluded communities, resulting in the following outcomes:

- 823 young people aged 14 to 28
- 63 children and adolescents
- 380 refugees, migrants, and returnees
- 90 fishing families from the Caribbean coasts
- 323 self-identified members of the LGBTIQ+ community
- 85 public officials

## **Main Results:**

- #NoEviction campaign for communities in economic emergency affected by the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown
- Baseline study on solid waste situation in the Quindío department
- Outreach in the Magdalena and Meta departments with direct educational actions on labor inclusion, preventive health, and environmental health
- Educational actions for the integration of Venezuelan refugees, migrants, and returnees
- Field visits to environmentally affected territories due to restrictions, lack of funding, and development gaps.


