How did 2022 unfold?

In 2022, a year marked by economic turbulence, social uncertainty, and a gradual process of socioeconomic and environmental regeneration following the prolonged lockdown due to the pandemic, the organization successfully developed projects informed by inputs and actions from prior years.

Impacts:

During 2022, actions were undertaken to strengthen, conduct applied research, and transfer technological skills, among other direct support initiatives for communities, including:

- 210 Victims of the armed conflict
- 96 Girls, Boys, and Adolescents
- 450 Refugee, Migrant, and Returning Women
- 154 Youth aged 18 to 28
- 220 Environmental Leaders
- 54 Afro-descendant Leaders
- 37 Indigenous Leaders
- 60 Leaders of Social Organizations

Key Results:

- Creation of Digitally Safe Committees in three localities of Bogotá: Kennedy, Puente Aranda, and Fontibón.
- Organization of the Environmental Governance Space, leading to the formation of the Jaboque Wetland Oversight Committee.
- Establishment of the Digital Violence Observatory for an Inclusive Digital Society, supported by organizations promoting human rights, migratory inclusion, and a culture of peace in central Colombia.
- Activation of environmental, cultural, and social processes with the support of the International University of La Rioja and the Health Department.

Impacts:

In 2022, initiatives were implemented to enhance applied research, transfer technological expertise, and undertake various actions aimed at directly supporting communities, including:

- 210 Victims of the armed conflict
- 96 Children, Adolescents - NNA
- 450 Refugee, Migrant, and Repatriated Women
- 154 individuals aged 18 to 28
- 220 Environmental Leaders
- 54 Afro-descendant leaders
- 37 Indigenous Leaders
- 60 Leaders of Social Organizations

- Establishment of the Digital Violence Observatory for an Inclusive Digital Society, supported by organizations advocating for human rights, migrant inclusion, and a culture of peace in central Colombia.
- Activation of environmental, cultural, and social processes with the assistance of the International University of La Rioja and the Ministry of Health.
